MAGH BIHU (15th January 2026)

Assam's Grand Harvest Festival

Magh Bihu, also known as Bhogali Bihu, is Assam's vibrant winter festival marking the end of the harvest with feasting, abundance, and deep community spirit. The eve, Uruka, is a joyous night where communities construct traditional bamboo huts (Meji and Bhelaghar) and gather for a hearty communal feast by the bonfire. At dawn, the burning of the Meji symbolizes purification and prayers for prosperity. Homes then overflow with homemade delicacies like pithas, laru, and jalpaan, while open fields come alive with various traditional rural sports, offering an authentic window into Assam's rich agrarian heritage.


DAY 3

Witness traditional Bihu rituals, rural games, and festive activities. In the evening, enjoy a cultural performance at Kaziranga Orchid Park.




DAY 4

Explore the iconic Kala Bhavana, marvel at sculptures by Ramkinkar Baij, or shop for local handicrafts at the bustling Sonajhuri Haat. Whether you visit for the colorful Basanta Utsav or a quiet walk through the Chhatimtala, Shantiniketan promises an unforgettable journey into art, heritage, and tranquility.















To fully experience Shantiniketan's heritage, culture, and serene village life, 2–3 nights is ideal—perfect for exploring Visva Bharati, Sonajhuri, and nearby sacred sites at a relaxed pace.

Suggested Itinerary



DAY 1

Kolkata to Shantiniketan (4–5 hrs) Drive to Shantiniketan and explore the historic Visva Bharati campus. Highlights include Kala Bhavan, China Bhawan, Uttarayan Complex, Chhatimtala, and the Prayer Hall. Overnight stay.



DAY 2

Visit Sonajhuri Tribal Village, known for its forests, Adivasi settlements, Kopai River, and the scenic Khoai region. Enjoy lunch at a local restaurant. Later visit Kankalitala, a revered Shaktipeeth located by the Kopai River. Overnight in Shantiniketan.



DAY 3

After breakfast, drive back to Kolkata (4–5 hrs).

- Getting There: The most popular route is by train from Kolkata to the Bolpur Santiniketan Railway Station, a journey of approximately 2.5 to 3 hours.
- Best Time to Visit: The winter months, from November to March, are the most popular due to the pleasant weather conditions for sightseeing.
 Monsoon season offers lush greenery.
- Accommodation: A range of options is available, including hotels, resorts, and homestays.
- Museum Timings: The Rabindra Museum is closed on Wednesdays and Thursdays.

From January 2026, Darjeeling will require visitors to carry dog vaccination cards and follow strict waste-disposal rules. A new annual dog licensing system and ₹500 spot fines aim to ensure responsible pet ownership.



Sundarbans to Close for Tiger Census on December 11–12

The Sundarbans will shut to tourists on December 11–12 for an extensive tiger census using 1,400 camera traps. The survey will track tiger and prey populations across 4,100 sq km with real-time data reporting.
